Servant Leaders

- Litmus Test 1: Who stands in the spotlight?
 - "Of course, there is a fly in the ointment of "scaling to the issue." It means giving up ownership of the issue, which can be difficult given the existence of egos, and more importantly perhaps, the reality that donors and investors drive organizations to differentiate themselves from others doing similar work, increasing fragmentation."

Litmus Test 2: Do those served then choose to serve also?
